How to Apply for WIC

- 1. Call your local county health department.
- 2. Call toll-free at 1-888-942-4673 for the agency closest to you. To qualify, you must...
- meet income requirements
- be a resident of Alabama
- be seen by a health professional at the WIC clinic.
- If you think you may qualify, please call the County Health Department to make an appointment.

At the WIC appointment, you will need to bring:

- proof of residency (a document with your street address on it, such as a lease or bill)
- proof of identity (a driver's license)
- proof of income (pay stubs OR you would be automatically income eligible if you are currently enrolled in TANF, Food Stamps or Medicaid, so bring proof of enrollment)
- •At the appointment once the above is documented, you will be evaluated for a nutritional risk which is the other main qualifying factor in determining benefit eligibility for pregnant, postpartum, breastfeeding women, infants and children under 5.

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How do I apply for Food Stamps?

You must file an application in the county where you live. You may call or write the local Food Stamp Office and an application will be sent to you or come into the office and get an application and complete it while you are there. Once you have filed the application, you will be given or mailed an appointment for an interview with a worker.

What do I need to bring to the interview?

Examples of information we need for all household members include proof of income, bank statements, current proof of rent or mortgage expenses, proof of child care expenses, Social Security numbers for everyone in the household and proof of legally obligated child support payments paid to someone outside the household.

How long does it take to process my application?

The county department has up to 30 days from the date youn turn in your application to notify you of a decision about your eligibility for Food Stamps. In some cases, if you have little or no income and resources, you may be entitled to expedited service and then a decision is made in 7 days from the date you turn in your application. You will be told when a decision must be made on your application when you are interviewed.

How do I use food stamps to buy food? Food stamp benefits are put into an EBT (Electronic Benefit Transfer) account for you each month. You will receive an EBT card to use like a credit card at the grocery store.

How do I apply for Child Support Services?

Child Support services are automatically provided to persons currently receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid, or Foster Care. Your TANF worker will refer you to the Child Support Unit and an appointment will be scheduled for you to come in and complete a child support application. TANF recipients must cooperate with child support in order to continue to receive benefits.

Other individuals as listed below may apply for child support services by making an appointment with any County Department of Human Resources office in Alabama. Click here to obtain the address and telephone number of your county DHR office. Call your local number and request an appointment to apply for child support services. Please print out the 3 forms shown below, complete all information, and bring the forms to your appointment.

Your caseworker will let you know if any additional information is needed. Depending on your income, a \$5 or \$25 fee is charged when you apply for child support services. This fee can be paid in cash or by money order and must be paid at the time of application.

The Alabama Department of Human Resources has agreements with child support attorneys around the state to provide legal representation. It is the attorney's duty to pursue the legal steps necessary to enforce or establish child support obligations from on-custodial parents. The attorney represents the State of Alabama only. Regardless of whether you receive TANF or not, no attorney-client relationship will exist between you and the child support attorney.

The child support attorney can address matters of child support only. If an action is filed relating to custody, visitation or any matter other than support, it will be necessary for you to seek private counsel to represent your interests in these issues.

Who can apply?

The person having responsibility for and exercising control of the child(ren),

such as a:

- Custodial Parent
- Grantee relative with care and control, but not custody of the child(ren)
- Alleged fathers wanting to establish paternity
- A representative of an agency holding custody of a child by order of the court
- Joint custodial parents with emancipated children who are owed arrears
- that accrued under a court order while the children were minors
- Pregnant Women
- Non-Custodial parents

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How to File Alabama Unemployment Online

Step 1

You'll first need to go to the Alabama Department of Industrial Relations web page (http://dir.alabama.gov/uc/claims.aspx) Then click "How to file a claim." Read more info by clicking on the three buttons. When you are ready to file, click the "Proceed" button.

Step 2

You will need the following: social security number; work history for the past 18 months that includes the business' phone number, address, and dates of employment; a copy of your military release paperwork if you were in the military in the past 18 months; your Trade Adjustment Assistance

(TAA) certification letter and/or TAA petition number. You will have the option to do a direct deposit on your benefits. If you choose this option have your bank routing and account number available, and a telephone number where you can be reached during business hours

Step 3

Enter the necessary information and make sure the last page confirms that your claim has been submitted. You must see this page or your claim has not been submitted. There are help buttons (question marks) on each page if you need assistance.

Step 4

At this point in the process you can file your weekly certification online once your unemployment compensation has been approved. To do that, you will go to the Alabama Department of Industrial Relations click the button "File weekly claim certification."
